Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations (Low-speed Vehicles) - Amending SOR/2008-229

This amendment to the Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations (MVSR) updates the requirements for the Low-speed Vehicles (LSV) class by: introducing requirements for a slow-moving vehicle emblem to be permanently marked on LSV; clarifying the original reason for establishing the LSV class, which was to allow the use of such vehicles for short trips such as shopping, social and recreational purposes, in limited, planned and controlled environments; introducing new wording that, for the first time, allows small trucks to be classified as LSV; including a maximum limit for the mass of LSV to ensure that large trucks and passenger vehicles cannot be improperly classified as LSV; and, introducing a requirement that the propulsion systems of LSV must be designed for their top speed of 40 km/h. http://canadagazette.gc.ca/partII/2008/20080806/html/sor229-e.html

Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents

Regulations Amending the Regulations Specifying Investigative Bodies

Part 1 of the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA) establishes rules to govern the collection, use and disclosure of personal information by organizations in the course of commercial activity. The legislation requires an organization which is disclosing personal information to obtain the individual's consent in most circumstances. An exception to this rule is found in paragraphs 7(3)(d) and (h.2) of the Act, which permit the disclosure of personal information to and by a private investigative body, without the knowledge or consent of the individual, if the investigative body is specified by the investigative bodies regulation.
