Three UN Agreements, adopted in 1958, 1997 and 1998 – establish regulatory instruments concerning motor vehicles and motor vehicle equipment:

- ✓ the 1958 Agreement UN Regulations;
- ★ the 1997 Agreement UN Rules (periodical technical inspections)



The 1958 Agreement

- Uniform technical prescriptions for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts and the conditions for reciprocal recognition of approvals
- 152 Regulations

Regulations under the UN Agreement contain provisions vehicles, their systems, parts and equipment related to safety environmental aspects. They include requirements, as well test administrative procedures for the type approval, the conformity of production and the mutual recognition of the type approvals granted by Contracting Parties.



UNECE WP 29 and TBT Agreement

The Administrative Committee set up by the 1958 Agreement is a **relevant international body** for the harmonization of vehicle regulations at international level

The Regulations adopted under the 1958 Agreement can be regarded as "relevant international standards" within the meaning of Article 2.4 of the TBT Agreement.



The adoption of UNECE Regulations by EU

- ✓ Article 218(9) TFEU
- ✓ Council Decisions on the accession of the EU to the 1958 and 1998 Agreements
- ✓ Commission Proposal + Council Decision + European Parliament informed
- ✓ "Mega Decision" three times per year establishes the position to be taken by the Commission on the Union's behalf in the WP.29 and empowers the Commission to vote on behalf of its Member States



UNECE Regulations and EU legislation

 In recent years, a large number of UN Regulations has been implemented into binding Union law:

- ✓ Directive 2007/46/EC incorporated UN Regulations in the EU type-approval system, either as requirements for type-approval or as alternatives to Union legislation.
- ✓ Regulation 2018/858 follows the same line (Impl, date: Sept. 2020)
- ✓ Regulation (EC) No 661/2009 on the general safety of motor vehicles repealed more than 50 EU Directives and replaced them with the corresponding UN Regulations
- ✓ Regulation (EU) No 2019/2144 repeals Regulations (EC) No 78/2009, 79/2009 and 661/2009 and their implementing measures (in total 19 regulations
