The Standard's updated status

The Israeli Standards are reviewed periodically, at least once every five years, in order to adapt them to scientific and technological developments.

Manufacturers using the Standards must ensure that they have the updated version, including its amendment sheets.

A document published in the Reshumot (Official Gazette) as an amendment can be a separate amendment sheet or an amendment integrated into the Standard.

The Standard's validity

An Israeli Standard including its amendments is effective from the date it is published in the Reshumot.

One should check whether the Standard is official or whether parts of it are official. An official Standard or official amendment sheet (in its entirety or partly) is effective 60 days from publication of a notice in the Reshumot, unless the notice specifies a later effective date.

The document mentioned must be deleted and replaced by the following:

BS 7177: 2008 – Specification for resistance to ignition of mattresses, mattress pads, divans and bed bases.

Paragraph 4. Materials and components

4.3 Mattress construction

4.3.1. The mattress core

- a. In the second line, the words: “103.2.2 type (a product containing fire resistant materials)”, must be deleted and replaced by:
103.2.1 type (a board which does not contain fire resistant materials).
- b. The last two lines must be deleted.
- c. In the second sentence, the words: “and it must comply with the fire behaviour test requirements” ... up to the words: “fire resistant materials”, must be deleted.
- d. In the second and third lines, the words: “and it must comply with the fire behaviour test requirements” ,, up to the words: “fire resistant materials”, must be deleted .

Paragraph 9. Resistance to burning cigarettes.

What is written in the paragraph, including the headings, must be deleted and replaced by:

9. Resistance to ignition.

The resistance of the mattress, bumpers and changing unit padding must be tested as detailed in British Standard BS 7177: 2008 regarding mattresses for home use.

The changing unit padding and bumper must be tested as a complete product only. A section of the padding or bumper must not be tested.

The resistance of the mattress, bumpers and changing unit padding must comply with all the requirements of the British Standard mentioned above.
