<u>Designation "Sitei Yakubutsu" (designated substances) and their proper use</u> <u>based on the provisions of the Pharmaceutical Affairs Law. (1960, Law No.145)</u>

In order to clarify the regulation under the Pharmaceutical Affairs Law, Government of Japan designates the following substances as "Sitei Yakubutsu" (designated substances). Manufacture, import and sale of "designated substances" will be banned except for proper use (ex: pharmaceuticals, standards for crime identification). These designations are in line with the current regulation of unapproved pharmaceuticals and effects on the current international trade activities will be minimal. The list of proposed "Sitei Yakubutsu" and their proper use are as follows;

"Sitei Yakubutsu"

- 1. *N*-ethyl-*N*-isopropyl-5-methoxytryptamine
- 2. 2-ethylamino-1-phenylpropan-1-one
- 3. 1-(4-chloro-2,5-dimethoxyphenyl)propan-2-amine
- 4. 1-(4-ethylsulfanyl-2,5-dimethoxyphenyl)propan-2-amine
- 5. 1-(4-fluorophenyl)-*N* methylpropan-2-amine
- 6. 1-(3,4-methylenedioxyphenyl)-2-(pyrrolidin-1-yl)pentan-1-one

Proper use for all the substances

- 1. to be used for education or research at universities, colleges and professional schools
- 2. to be used for tests under Pharmaceutical Affairs Law, and
- 3. to be used for crime identification
