Regulations Governing the Labeling of Formula for Certain Disease (Draft)

- 1. The Regulations are established under the provisions of Article 22 Paragraph 1 Subparagraph 10 of the Act Governing Food Safety and Sanitation.
- 2. Formula for certain disease shall have containers or packages labeled with the following information, as required in addition to general information requirements:
 - (1) The applicable subjects.
 - (2) Storage instructions before and after the package is opened.
 - (3) Usage and dosage instructions.
 - (4) Warning statement: "This product is a formula food for certain disease, and it is not suitable for the general population and must be taken under the instruction of a doctor or registered dietitian", or words of similar meaning. (text shall appear bold and be distinct from the background color).
 - (5) Warning statement: "Increasing dosage will not help improve this type of disease", or words of similar meaning.
 - (6) Warning statement: "This product is not for intravenous use", or words of similar meaning.
 - (7) Tube-feeding formulas must specify the osmotic pressure.
 - (8) Precautions.
 - (9) Others.
- 3. In addition to the foregoing requirements, different categories and natures of formula food for certain disease shall have the following additional information printed on the container or package:
 - (1) Nutritionally complete food with balance formula:

All products must specify the percentage calories of the three major nutrients, fiber, lactose and other nutrient content recommended in the dietary reference intakes for citizens.

- (2) Nutritionally complete food with customized formula:
 - A. All products must specify the percentage calories of the three major nutrients, fiber, lactose and other nutrient content recommended in the dietary reference intakes for citizens.

- B. Products customized with additional or reduced nutrients/ingredients based on either empirical evidence or clinical trial must specify the "added", "enhanced", "reduced" or "removed" nutrient/ingredient.
- (3) Nutrition adjusted supplementary formula food:
 - A. All products must specify the percentage calories of the three major nutrients, fiber, lactose and other nutrient content recommended in the dietary reference intakes for citizens.
 - B. Products customized with additional or reduced nutrients/ingredients based on either empirical evidence or clinical trial must specify the "added", "enhanced", "reduced" or "removed" nutrient/ingredient.
 - C. Where a product does not contain the essential fatty acids, such must be clearly stated on the product (e.g. "This product does not contain the essential fatty acids."). Where a product does not contain one of the two essential fatty acids, Linoleic acid (LA) or α-Linolenic acid (ALA), such must be clearly stated on the product (e.g. "This product does not contain Linolenic acid, an essential fatty acid" or "This product does not contain α-Linolenic acid, an essential fatty acid").
 - D. The product label must contain this warning message in bold: "This product should not be used as the sole source of nutrients".
- (4) Special modular formula food:
 - A. Products with nutritional contents or ingredients adjusted according to empirical evidence or clinical trial must specify so on the label.
 - B. The product label must contain this warning message in bold: "This product should not be used as the sole source of nutrients".
