Requires all personal audio players distributed in New Jersey to contain a warning about volume and hearing loss.

1	AN ACT concerning personal audio players and supplementing Title
2	56 of the Revised Statutes.
3	
4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:
6	
7	1. As used in this act:
8	"Manufacturer" means a person who manufactures or imports a
9	personal audio player for distribution in this State.
10	"Personal audio player" means a personal, electronic device that
11	allows the user to listen to audio while mobile.
12	
13	2. No manufacturer shall distribute a personal audio player in
14	this State unless the manufacturer affixes a warning label on the
15	personal audio player that reads as follows: "WARNING: This
16	product may cause hearing damage. A volume level of 115 decibels
17	may cause permanent hearing damage after 15 minutes of
18	exposure."
19	
20	3. Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall be
21	subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 for each offense
22	Any civil penalty imposed pursuant to this act may be collected by
23	the Attorney General with costs in a summary proceeding pursuant
24	to the "Penalty Enforcement Law of 1999," P.L.1999, c.274
25	(C.2A:58-10 et seq.).

27	4. This act shall take effect on the 180th day following
28	enactment.

31	STATEMENT
32	
33	This bill is in response to the harmful volume levels at which
34	users of portable audio players (e.g., MP3 players or iPods) are able
35	to listen. Many of these portable audio players can be listened to a
36	volumes of up to 130 decibels. The Occupational Safety and Health
37	Administration in the United States Department of Labor has stated
38	that significant hearing loss can occur in 15 minutes at a volume of
39	115 decibels.
40	This bill prohibits a manufacturer from distributing a personal
41	audio player in this State unless the manufacturer affixes a warning
42	label on the personal audio player that reads as follows:
43	"WARNING: This product may cause hearing damage. A volume
44	level of 115 decibels may cause permanent hearing damage after 15
45	minutes of exposure."
